# **Guide to Copyright License Form**

#### Why am I being asked to fill out this form?

This form gives Clarkson University the right to digitize, duplicate, and publicly share your M.S. or Ph.D. thesis, as well as add the thesis to Clarkson's digital repository.

Upon being received by the library, your dissertation/thesis will be able to be checked in/out by both the Clarkson community and general public, and potentially sent to other libraries via interlibrary loan. If you do not want this to take place, you must embargo your work using this form. Additionally, if this form is incomplete or not signed, the library will not be able to catalog your work or place it in circulation.

## Need help filling out this form? Guide to The Form

#### Section # 1 – Copyright Status

In this section you should fill in your name and the name of your thesis. It also is a statement that you have not signed away your copyright to another entity such as a publisher. Note that submission of a thesis to the ProQuest database does not affect copyright status. If you have sold or signed away the copyright to your thesis, Clarkson can not distribute it and you should not sign this form.

#### Section # 2 - Your Status

These statements verify that you actually have the ability to grant copyright permission. The requirements are

a. You are at least 18 years of age.

b. You are not an employee of an entity (company or government agency) that requires copyright ownership of your thesis as part of your employment agreement.

### Section # 3 – Granting Rights

Signing this form indicates agreement to all of the following terms:

- a. allows the University to create print copies of your work and distribute them for library purposes.
- allows the university the right to digitize your work and/or convert it to other formats that
  may exist in the future. allows the University to grant access to your work to Clarkson
  Community members including students, employees, trustees, and other library card
  holders.
- c. allows the University to grant unlimited access to your work; in other words, access would not be limited to only the Clarkson Community.
- d. grants the widest possible permissions to the University through a "transferable, irrevocable license," including publication, distribution and display.

This will also allow the abstract, bibliography and metadata to be published in the library catalog and library databases.

#### Section # 4 – The Embargo

An "Embargo" is a delay prior to placing your materials in the Clarkson University institutional repository, both physical and digital.

- a. If you wish to place an embargo on your materials, please check yes and indicate a date for the embargo to end.
- b. If you do not wish to place an embargo on your materials, allowing them to be used immediately, leave this blank.

#### Section # 5 - Signature

You must provide your printed name and a signature (signed either physically or digitally, with confirmation of digital signature) for this form to be valid. Failure to provide your signature will result in your Work not being added to the Library collection.

#### Section # 6 – The Image Release

This optional section gives the University permission to use your name and image to promote your thesis.
